

# Recent (ish) change in education...

GCSE grading: A\* - G has been replaced with 9-1



### KS2 scoring:

- Levels have been replaced with a score from 80-120.
- A score of 100 is approximately equivalent to what was known as a 4b/4c.







KS2 Maths and English converted to an approximate GCSE score (the number you see).





# GCSE predicted grades: these are a guide, they are not a prophesy!





...and they are not glass ceilings



Students should make approximately 1 grade of progress a year.

Progress is not linear however and this will naturally vary for different subjects.

### An example of what may happen:

- Student enters SVC with a KS2 score of 100.
- This score is approximately 1.5 on our scale.
- This means in 5 years time they should be aiming for GCSE scores of around about a 6


