



GCSE PE

- 60% Theory 2 Exams
- 40% practical 3 Sports and Coursework
- If considering this option then your child MUST be participating in a sports club outside of school.

BTEC Sport

- Study 4 Units
- 1 unit or 25% Exam
- 3 units or 75% Coursework
- Still involves practical elements but there is less emphasis on performing at a high level to achieve the best grade.

 - Students who successfully apply may have represented the county at Under 14 level or above, or have represented the school in at least 3 sports for 3 years.
