Money Mules Warning for Parents

Dear Parent or Guardian,
We need your help to warn young people about the dangers and consequences of becoming a money mule.



What is a money mule?

A money mule is someone who transfers stolen money through their own bank account on behalf of someone else and is paid for doing so. Criminals need money mules to launder the profits of their crimes. Young people are increasingly being targeted to become money mules. They are approached online or in person, including through social media, at school, college or sports clubs. Sometimes people they know persuade them to take part, often because they are also acting as money mules. Mules will usually be unaware of where the money comes from and that it can go on to fund crimes such as drug dealing and people trafficking. When someone is caught, their bank account will be closed, and they will have problems getting student loans, mobile phone contracts and credit in the future. They could even face arrest for money laundering which carries a maximum sentence of 14 years in prison.

What to look out for; suddenly having extra cash, buying expensive new clothes or top-of-the-range mobile phones and gadgets with very little explanation as to how they got the money. They may also become more secretive, withdrawn or appear stressed.

Soham Pumpkin Fair 2019

After a challenging week, Saturday 28th September dawned with the promise of little or no rain for Soham. Despite blustery winds, competition entries flooded in throughout the morning as gigantic pumpkins, enormous sunflowers and other various shapes of vegetable arrived at the Recreation Ground. Decorated cakes, floral arrangements, art and poetry were also entered into the indoor competitions area, showing off the creativity of local groups and residents. Many emphasised this year's theme of the '75th anniversary of the Soham Rail Disaster'.

With judging complete, it was revealed that the heaviest pumpkin was grown by Andrew Fletcher with a weight of 375kg. Other outstanding entries were: the heaviest potato grown by Chloë Phillips at 1.127kg and the heaviest onion grown by Charles Warner at 1.695kg.

This year for the first time, we held a pet show (run by Perfeq Pets). The baby ferrets from Cambridgeshire Ferret Rescue won '*The pet the judge would most like to take home*'. At 1.30pm the fair was opened by Rev. Eleanor Whalley, who then went on to judge the children's fancy dress. Arena events then followed with displays by the local schools, Dad's Army Singers; A George Formby Ukelele Tribute, Ferret Racing, Ely Irish Dancing and Kuk Sool Won martial arts.

There were static displays from; Soham Museum; Bygones & Scrapbooks and Soham Heritage & Tourism Group among others. There were regular favourites appearing too: a collection of classic vehicles; charity stalls; a craft tent; a fun fair and of course a BBQ, Refreshments and a wide range of food and produce. The afternoon ended with a raffle and the prize-giving ceremony, where cups, trophies and certificates were awarded to all the winners of the day.

The fair proved to be a great day out for the local community, while raising money for many worthy causes.

Our main beneficiaries this year are:

- St Andrews Church - to help with the restoration project
- Soham Community Group - to help fund the new day centre
- Friends of Soham Village College - to help improve outdoor seating areas for their students.

Our thanks to the various organisations, companies and people of Soham and local area for their fantastic support making the 45th fair as successful as many of those that have gone before!

Funding for healthcare across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough is under pressure. More people are using NHS services locally, and resources are limited. At the moment, the local NHS is buying more than it can afford which means that some difficult decisions need to be made about the services it can afford to provide in the future.

The BIG conversation has been created to help Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), who buy the healthcare services in the local area, to understand what is most important to the local community. Feedback received will be used to create a set of principles that will inform our future plans and help shape our local NHS.


