Students will learn what they need to do to make the most of a visit such as, having a purpose to it; demonstrating correct personal conduct; and participating fully in all 	Assessment will take the form of a written plan and research into planning their visit, and a practical element of actually participating in the visit. They will then be expected to complete a detailed written evaluation of all aspects of the task. The assessment will start at the end of the Spring term and will run over into the start of the Summer term.
