FLT BTEC Vocational Studies—Years 10 & 11



	In order to achieve the BTEC Level 1 Introductory Certificate in Vocational Studies , students will study the units outlined below. Because of the nature of this BTEC qualification, students will study most units over the 2 years, with teaching being paused at appropriate moments. Students are able to achieve a Pass/Merit/Distinction grade within the Level 1 qualification. The unit also enables students to work on non-assessed practical work in designated areas of the school including the FLT garden.

Unit A2: Developing a Personal Progression Plan	 Students will complete self-assessment tasks, evaluating their strengths, areas for development and explore their mind-set Students will complete work to explore possible Post-16 college courses. Students will complete work to explore career choices. As part of this unit students will complete their Personal Statements and college applications, but this will be done in Year 11. The unit compliments other Personal Progression units for Hospitality and Tourism and Health and Social Care. 	Continuous assessment throughout the unit. Students will complete a portfolio of evidence. Students will produce a Progression Plan centred around their plans for post-16 education.
Unit HT5: Preparing and Cooking Food	 In Year 10 students will prepare and cook a series of basic dishes, focusing on dishes that will enable them to live independently. Students do not pay for ingredients, but may be asked to bring in extras if they wish to. In the autumn term of Year 11, students will prepare a Christmas parcel for veterans of the Royal British Legion. In Year 11 students will plan, prepare, cook and evaluate a meal that will form part of their final assessment. 	In Year 10 students complete evaluations at the end of every cook. For their final assessment in Year 11, students will plan, prepare, cook and evaluate the creation of a main meal.
