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Introduction

Soham Village College has a Careers Programme in place that aims to prepare students for life after GCSEs and beyond. From college and course choices, to investigating career pathways, and organising employer engagement experiences to develop students' employability skills (communication, teamwork, problem solving, creativity, planning, organisation), the programme provides all students with impartial advice and guidance aligned to their specific needs.

The programme is delivered by the CEIAG team with support from a range of stakeholders, to give our students guidance on their options - tutors, external CEIAG providers, local employers, local colleges and universities, parents and the local authority. CEIAG is included within the PSHE program for years 7-11 as well as careers being embedded within the curriculum. Leaflets, prospectuses and careers books are available in the Resource Centre, and our school website holds a wealth of up-to-date information for both students, parents and employers, together with links to useful websites. Parents are kept informed via the Careers newsletter, Parentmail and social media. Parent information evenings are excellent opportunities for the CEIAG Manager to promote the resources and support available for students at any stage in their career decision process.

In Years 7 and 8 we introduce the subject of careers and the future, helping students think about what jobs are out there and investigate employability skills such as communication and teamwork. Students complete a Skills Questionnaire in Year 7 to establish their level of understanding of all-things careers at that point as well as how they feel about the skills they currently have.

In Year 9 we focus deeper on employability skills through the World of Work project where students take part in activities such as marketing, teamwork and problem solving, and how they can link their favourite subjects to certain jobs. Students are introduced to Further and Higher Education options. Students complete a Skills Questionnaire to establish their level of understanding of all-things careers at that point as well as how they feel about the skills they currently have.

Year 10 sees students introduced to their Post 16 college options through Taster Days and the MyChoice16 application process. All students attend the Ely Careers Fair. Targeted students take part in Work Experience in the local area in order to prepare them for life after school, enabling them to develop awareness of the skills and attitudes that will be expected of them. Careers guidance meetings with our Level 6 qualified advisor begin in the Spring term.

Year 11 is a busy year as students are given support and guidance in order to submit their college applications before Christmas. Students take part in a College Application Day, where they have a Personal Statement workshop and are given time to work on their applications. They also prepare for and take part in a mock interview. We identify students most at risk of becoming NEET and provide them with extra support and guidance with every aspect of applying to college, including careers guidance meetings. These meetings for all students also continue through the Autumn term. A survey of the previous year's cohort showed the most helpful events were the College Open Evenings and Taster Days, plus the personal statement workshop and mock interviews during Year 11. Both students and parents agreed that research and early planning were key in navigating the college application process during Year 11.

Our **Alumni network** continues to develop and grow, enabling us to invite former students and also local employers in to talk to all students during the year. This employer engagement is a critical part of the programme to inspire and motivate students to consider their future plans after their Post 16 destination.

Foundation Learning Transitions

The Foundation Learning Tier are supported in tutor time and lessons working as a group with Ben Thompson and Carol Le Roy. They also have developed a mentoring project with Stephen Blackmore from Turners of Soham.

Pupil Premium Transition

All Yr9 pupil premium students take part in a careers support workshop to get them thinking about their options after Yr11. They also all have the opportunity to speak to a member of teaching staff or the careers team about their GCSE Options in April.

We can make provision to help students get to college taster days or guidance meetings if their parents are unable to get them there. We monitor their applications closely in the build up to the MyChoice16 deadline.

SEN Transition

We work with the SEN department when creating the risk of NEET list to help support SEN students.

ISLE Transition

Students on an alternative provision plan work with Moira Kemp and on occasions, the school may set up work experience placements to provide support within the alternative provision plan.

Targeted Intervention and Support

Mentors and support staff work with students who require additional targeted support, and where necessary work closely with the Careers Team.
