Success for Girls Teams

Our girls' football teams have had an excellent run in the ESFA Schools football competition. We only enter teams into this tournament after success in the previous year, so it is exciting to see how well our students can do in this national football competition.



First Round

Under 15s

Soham's U15 girls started the English Schools FA Cup in style with a 3-0 win over Chesterton. This was a hard-fought game with the score slightly flattering Soham Village College. However, the difference was that Soham's U15s made their chances count. Evie continued her goal scoring from last season with the opening goal in the first half. Then there was a mesmerising run from Soham's captain Scarlett from her central defensive position, dribbling past several Chesterton players before shooting and scoring to make it 2-0. This all but sealed the result. Chesterton had chances, but they couldn't breach Soham's defence and, with the arrival of Molly, it was soon 3-0 when she converted a cross with a delightful header.

Under 14s

Our U14 girls started their English Schools FA Cup with a hard-fought win against a very physical side from Stephen Perse. Soham controlled parts of the game and went 1-0 up early in the second half, but Stephen Perse replied almost

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immediately. Soham then took control of the game and it was soon 2-1, but as the first half drew to a close Soham could not hold on to the lead and the first half ended all square at 2-2. Soham started the second half well and again took the lead, but Stephen Perse continued to be a threat. Then, a great run in behind gave Niamh a shot on target. After rounding one defender, and from an acute angle, Niamh slotted the ball home to make it 4-2. This looked to have sealed the result, but again Stephen Perse had other ideas and, with a long ball to the right, their player controlled the ball and lofted it over Soham's GK to nestle in the back of the net. This made it a shaky last eight minutes, but Soham held on.

Second Round

Under 16s

The U16s had their first game together as a team against Swavesey at home and it was a very nervy start, with Swavesey starting the much brighter side and going in at half time 2-0 up. However, in the second half, Soham's U16s started to play much better and Isla put through to Evie to pull it back to 2-1. Soham showed their resilience and soon started to play to their full potential. It wasn't long before Isla found the net to make it 2-2, and soon after found the net again to make it 3-2. Although this wasn't a convincing win, it showed the U16s have the potential to come from behind and grind out a result.

Under 15s

The U15s went away to Northgate Academy near Ipswich in the ESFA second round. Northgate were the Suffolk County Cup holders and so this was going to be a test for our U15 District Cup holders. The first half was a very tight affair, with neither team dominating play or making many chances. However, just before half time, Izzy managed to find a way through for Soham to go 1-0 up.

The second half became far more open, with Northgate looking for the equaliser. However, this gave Evie the chance to latch onto a cross in a crowded penalty box, giving her a shot on goal. She buried this in the right-hand corner. Northgate then pulled one back almost immediately and came close to equalising with a well taken freekick. This was defended by Soham's captain (Scarlett), who managed to clear the ball off the line, beating the goalkeeper. Soham then started to dominate play and substitute Molly netted another goal to make it 3-1. It then became one-way traffic with Evie getting a fourth and Molly getting a fifth to win the game 5-1.

Under 14s

The U14 team travelled away to Thomas Gainsborough in Sudbury, Suffolk. This was a very one-sided affair with the U14s dominating play and we netting two goals in the first half. Soham continued to dominate in the second half and again netted a hat trick. Thomas Gainsborough managed to pull back a consolation goal, but the



game was pretty much over at 5-1 and could easily have been close to double figures.

Third Round

Under 14s

The U14s travelled to Spalding on 19 October for their third-round fixture. Soham were slow to get going and, against a very good team, this did not bode well. Soham just couldn't put together their usual flowing football. Soham's long-range shot did hit the cross bar, but we found ourselves going in at half time 2-0 down. A spirited second half saw us play much better and we did manage to pull a goal back, but it was all too late. Soham U14s can be proud of the way they played and will be back next year to try and progress further.

Under 16s

The U16s were convincingly beaten by a very good Debenham team on 9 November at home. It didn't help that Soham were missing some key players. The first half was very one-sided and Debenham managed to score five goals before the end of the half. Soham's second half was much better and they only conceded one goal, with Soham's Eloise pulling one back to make it 6-1. However, that's the end of the road for the U16s.

Under 15s

The U15s played their third round draw against Farlingaye on 14 November. This was a completely different story to the U14s and U16s, with Soham U15s dominating from the start. Unfortunately, Soham's leading scorer (Evie) was unavailable, so Soham relied on Molly and Zoe to lead the line. Neither players disappointed and both grabbed a goal. Although Farlingaye had some good players, they just couldn't breach the Soham defence and, with Scarlett back from injury, there was just no way through for the Farlingaye attack. Soham added two more goals to make it 4-0 at the break, with Scarlett bundling in a goal line scuffle and a terrific run and strike from Maddie which found the top right corner.

The second half was equally one sided and Isla, who had just come off the bench, added a fifth almost immediately. Molly grabbed the sixth and her second of the match to become Soham's leading scorer in the U15s.

Fourth Round

Our U15 boys managed to progress through to the fourth round where they unfortunately lost 4-3 to Hinchingbrooke. A late goal and strong penalty shout went against us late on after a very strong second half. The goal scorers were Bobby and Max.
