Not a GCSE

- Health and Social Care is a BTEC subject
 - BTEC stands for the **Business and Technology Education Council**. BTECs are specialist work-related qualifications, combining practical learning with subject and theory content.
 - It is worth the same as a GCSE, it is just a more vocational subject.
- BTEC Health and Social Care is about working in a Health or Social Care setting.
- There is an opportunity to do work experience.
- You learn about the <u>skills</u> needed to work in these settings.
 These skills can be used in any future career, not just one with Health and Social Care.

Assessment

- BTEC Health and Social Care is assessed by:
 - A 2 hour exam in year 11 (40%)
 - Two coursework assignments (60%)
- A coursework dominated subject rewards hard work and motivation.

 The exam will be in the Spring term when you have less pressure from other exams.

The Topics

- Year 10
 - Development across life stages (physical, Intellectual, Emotional, Social).
 - Factors which affect development (physical, social, cultural, financial).
 - Life events which shape us (i.e. 2020's lockdowns).

Year 11

- Health and social care services (i.e. paramedics, family workers, charities).
- Care values (i.e. confidentiality, safe guarding, respect).
- Health issues (i.e. obesity, smoking).
- Improving Health and Well-being.

Assignment 1 (30%)

Part 1

- Write about two life stages.
- How do people develop physically, intellectually, emotionally and socially across each of these life stages?

Part 2

- Write about two factors that affect their development?
 - Wealth
 - Health
 - Relationships etc

Part 3

- Write about two people who have been through a life event.
 - Health, accidents
 - Relationship changes
 - Parenthood etc
- How did it affect them?
- What support did they have?

Task 1

 Write a report about the health care services which will support an individual in a case study

Task 2

 Write a report about the social care services which will support an individual in a case study

Task 3

 Suggest obstacles to receiving care for an individual in a case study and describe ways this could be overcome

Task 4

 Write about the skills and values a healthcare professional should have.

Task 5

 Write about the skills and values a healthcare professional has could help an individual overcome barriers.

Exam (40%)

- 2 hours
- February of Year 11
- Mock exam in November
- Four week revision programme after Christmas holiday

- Case study
- Discuss factors that are affecting the persons life
 - i.e. relationships, living conditions
- Evaluate health and lifestyle data
 - i.e. blood pressure, BMI
- Design a plan to improve health and wellbeing
- Suggest short and long term targets and sources of support
