#### National Apprenticeship week: 5 - 11 February 2024

Apprenticeships are now an established and recognised further education option for students leaving Soham Village College in Year 11. They generate a lot of interest when students start looking at their options during Year 10, and sometimes even before that. Last year 20 students left to take up an apprenticeship in the local area.

The process of researching, finding and securing an apprenticeship can be quite complicated but there is lots of help and support available, either from the school's Careers Team, local colleges or national websites. National Apprenticeship Week is an opportunity to celebrate the apprenticeship pathway, and to highlight where information can be obtained.

A genuine job with a linked assessment and skills development programme

A way for young people to earn while they learn

Generally, 80% of time spent working and 20% of time in college/being assessed at work

Contract of employment including holiday pay

Available at a number of levels across a wide range of occupations and sectors

A viable alternative pathway for students who wish to enter the world of work rather than continue in full time education

## **Guide to applying for an apprenticeship**

**Research** – is the key. The earlier you start (where to find vacancies, how to apply etc) the better your chance of getting the apprenticeship you want

**Process** – you are effectively applying for a job, so expect to complete an application form, have a CV, possibly write a covering letter, and attend an interview

**Competition** – don't forget there might be lots of competition for vacancies so here are some top tips get ahead of the crowd:

- contact businesses early get yourself known in the local area so businesses know you will be looking for an apprenticeship. Doing this during Year 10 is not too early!
- family and friends contacts who do you know already working in or has links with your chosen industry?
- industry knowledge increase your knowledge through research
- work experience helps with your CV and shows businesses you are keen
- think about what you can do to show you are more interested in the industry or job than everyone else

**How to apply** – how you apply will differ depending on where the vacancy is being advertised, and also which college is supporting the business offering the apprenticeship

An apprenticeship is not the 'easier option' compared to going onto college. A fair amount of work needs to go into researching and securing an apprenticeship.

Best advice is apply for a full time college course as well as searching for an apprenticeship, so you have at least a back-up should your apprenticeship plans not turn out as expected.
