Dear Parent / Carer,

Year 8 Geography Field Trip to Hunstanton, Norfolk Monday 29 June 2026

The geography department is planning an optional fieldtrip for Year 8 students. This visit links to the work on coasts which your child will be studying this year in geography. We will look at land use in a coastal town, coastal erosion and the use of sea defences. The visit will develop fieldwork skills and allow students to experience a contrasting location.

We will travel to Hunstanton by coach on Monday 29 June 2026, leaving College at 8:45am and returning by 3:00pm. Students will not be expected to wear school uniform, but clothing needs to be appropriate and sensible with comfortable shoes for walking all day and a warm, waterproof layer. Sun cream is also recommended. Students will need a packed lunch and plenty to drink. Additionally, students may wish to bring a small amount of pocket money in case there is an opportunity to buy something e.g., an ice cream. Hunstanton is a small seaside town, and there will be some walking through the high street and along the seafront, where students will be supervised by staff in groups.

The total cost of this visit will be less than £25. We have planned to run a second day if there is enough interest from students and will finalise the cost when we know how many people are interested.
